Comment

- The table shows application numbers and claims values in comparison with the same period in the previous financial year.
- The lower level of applications reflects a continuing decline in the level of activity in the State's construction industry.
- There is however an uptick in the value of those payment disputes.




Comment

- The table shows the distribution of adjudicator appointments made by the five active appointors prescribed under the Construction Contracts Regulations 2004.
- IAMA returned as the lead appointor body for this quarter.
- Of the 34 appointments for payment dispute resolution by adjudication there were 9 dismissals, 6 withdrawals and 19 determinations.

Comment

- For the reporting period adjudication services were used by nine of the State's construction industry sectors.
- The residential sector led the number of applications but at a low value ranking.
- A Civil Works/Infrastructure project led claims by value.
- The Mining/oil and gas sector continued to retreat from its historical dominance by claims number and value.

- Adjudication activity data is reported for the first quarter, then half yearly, then third quarter and then aggregated into the Annual Report to the Minister in accordance with s.52 of the Construction Contracts Act 2004.
