# **Energy Bulletins**

In reply to many enquiries since the inception of the Office of Energy (OOE) on 1 January 1995 we have prepared the following question and answer segment.

We trust that this will be of benefit to you. Please contact us if you require further assistance.

**Q.**Now that SECWA no longer exists, can I still use the existing SECWA Preliminary Notices and Notices of Completion?

**A.**Yes. However the OOE will shortly be introducing new notices that are designed to be used by all the Western Australian supply authorities. A further Energy Bulletin will advise on the new notices and when the existing supply authority notices (eg SECWA) will no longer be accepted.

**Q.**Where do I report instances of electrical shock?

**A.**To the relevant supply authority and the OOE.

**Note:** Instances of electric shock must also be reported to the employer or employer's representative (eg supervisor).

**Q.**Who do I contact to obtain a ruling in relation to a consumers' electrical installation?

**A.**The relevant supply authority (eg. in the South West of Western Australia Western Power).

**Q.**If I have a question in regard to the application of Australian Standards (eg AS 3000) who do I contact?

**A.**In the first instance you need to contact an Electrical Inspector from the

relevant supply authority.

**Q.**Who carries out mine site electrical inspections?

**A.**The OOE's Electrical Inspectors carry out this function for the Department of Minerals & Energy.

**Q.**Are submissions required for high voltage installations?

**A.**Yes. If the installation is to be connected to a supply authority's system then the submission is to be sent to the relevant supply authority.

For installations that are supplied from their own generating plant the submissions are to be directed to the OOE.

**Q.**What is the function of the Electrical Licensing Board?

**A.**The primary function of the Board is to determine the competence and suitability of applicants for, and holders of, electrical licences and advising the Minister and the Director of Energy Safety on matters affecting electrical licences

**Q.**What action may the Electrical Licensing Board take with errant licensees?

## **A.** They may

- require the licensee to explain their conduct in writing or in person before the Board
- conduct a disciplinary hearing
- impose a condition on or cancel a person's licence
- require persons to undergo an examination or assessment
- advertise details of disciplinary actions

**Q.**What services does the Licensing Office provide?

**A.**It provides the secretariat for Electrical Licensing Board and:

- develops electrical and gas licensing policy and procedures
- advises on licence applications
- processes licence applications
- maintains the register of gas and electrical licences
- issues information and saleable publications (including some Australian Standards)

**Q.**Do I need to have electrical appliances approved?

**A.**Yes, electrical appliances that are prescribed pursuant to the Electricity Act 1945 must be approved by the Director of Energy Safety (OOE) prior to sale or hire.

Prescribed articles include domestic appliances, plugs and sockets, electric hand tools and electrical equipment used generally.

**O.**How can I obtain approval for an electrical appliance?

**A.**Applications for approval must be submitted to the OOE.

The OOE will process the application and attached test certificate, and if accepted will issue an **Approval Certificate** valid for five years.

In Western Australia, Western Power offers a wide range of testing services for electrical appliances.

#### **Electrical Installations**

#### **Restricted Zones - Kitchen Sinks**

Large kitchen sink units are becoming increasingly popular in modern houses.

AS 3000 - 1991 Clause 6.4.2(e) requires that electrical equipment must not be installed in restricted zones near sinks, hand basins or similar fixed water containers.

Where **large sink units exceeding 20 litres capacity** are fitted, the restricted zone must be considered under clause 6.4.2(f), ie electrical equipment must not be installed within the space contained by the vertical planes 0.5 m from the boundaries of the water container and extending from the floor to a horizontal plane 1 m above the water container.

## W.A. Electrical Requirements

Electrical Industry Bulletin #28 (Nov 1994) included amended provisions for main switches for installations supplied from a substation (Amendment SER 1/94).

In response to enquiries, it is advised that main switch fuses greater than 250A can only be used in accordance with Table 2.6 when permitted under Clause 2.8.1.1 of the W.A. Electrical Requirements.

#### **Aerial Bundled Cables - Customer Connections**

Aerial Bundled Cables (ABC) are being installed by supply authorities as low voltage service cable in some areas.

Details of requirements for customer connections to ABC are available from the supply authorities. It is intended that further information on this subject will be provided in a future issue of the Energy Bulletin.
