



## Manual Tasks Checklist

This checklist provides general guidance on managing the risks associated with hazardous manual tasks in the workplace. It is not intended to be exhaustive and you may need to consider other risk factors which are unique to your organisation.

Tick the appropriate response. A "No" answer indicates the need for control measures to eliminate or reduce the risk of manual task injuries.

Risk management		
Have all hazardous manual tasks been identified?		
Have risk assessments been completed for identified tasks?		
Have control measures been put in place by considering improvements in the work area, the system of work, the objects being handled and the equipment to do the task?		
Are known risks and control strategies communicated to workers?		
Have workers received training on manual task risk management, how to perform manual tasks safely, the use of mechanical aids, tools, equipment and safe work procedures; and how to report a problem or maintenance issue?		
Are risk assessments performed before purchasing equipment, like tools, containers, workstations, machinery and vehicles?		
Work equipment		
Are mechanical aids (such as trolleys and hoists) available and used?		
Are workstations easily adjustable to suit a range of workers and the tasks they perform?		
Is equipment regularly inspected, serviced and maintained?		
Work organisation		
Are tasks rotated to avoid repetitive work?		
Is work planned to balance out periods of high and low demand?		
Are jobs and tasks organised so that workers have adequate breaks from sustained postures, repetitive movement and manual handling?		
Is work is organised to minimise multiple handling?		
Work area		
Is adequate space provided for areas where manual tasks are performed?		
Are items that are regularly-used within easy reach?

Can workers see displays comfortably from the work position?		
Is storage for equipment and materials provided close to where used?		
Are storage units stable and kept in good condition?		
Are storage shelves organised to minimise bending and stretching?		
Are commonly used and heavy items stored between mid-thigh and shoulder height?		
Are floor surfaces maintained in good, smooth and clean condition to enable easy use of equipment (eg trolleys)?		
Responding to incidents		
Is there a system in place to report manual task incidents and hazards?		
Have all reported manual task incidents and hazards been investigated?		
Have outcomes of investigations been communicated to the reporting worker?		
Are current control measures reviewed after accidents have occurred?
