## Public Sector Wages Policy Statement 2022

- 1. Except as provided by clause 2, this Statement:
  - a. rescinds and replaces the <u>Public Sector Wages Policy Statement 2019</u> with effect from 11 February 2022 (the effective date); and
  - b. applies to public sector industrial agreements registered on or after the effective date.
- 2. The Public Sector Wages Policy Statement 2019 continues in effect in relation to public sector industrial agreements replacing agreements that expired before 9 September 2021.
- 3. Subject to clause 4, the Government of Western Australia requires increases in industrial agreement wages for public sector employees to be limited to 2.5% per annum.
- 4. In addition to the 2.5% per annum wage limit, public sector unions negotiating on behalf of employees for an industrial agreement can nominate to receive either:
  - a. a one-off \$1,000 sign-on payment for full time equivalent employees on registration of the industrial agreement; or
  - b. an additional 0.25% per annum wage increase in return for industrially based reform measures leading to enhanced efficiency or improved quality of service delivery.
- 5. The \$1,000 sign-on payment will be pro rata for part time and casual employees.
- 6. The 0.25% per annum wage increase and \$1,000 sign-on payment are mutually exclusive. The nominated option will apply to all employees covered by the industrial agreement.
- 7. Subject to Government approval, negotiated outcomes may include conditions that support Government's workforce priorities.
- 8. The cost of negotiated and arbitrated outcomes must be met from the approved salary expense limit of affected departments and organisations.
- 9. The minimum term for industrial agreements registered after the effective date is two years.
- 10. This Statement is to be read in conjunction with <u>Premier's Circular 2021/03</u> (or its replacement) and the Public Sector Bargaining Framework.
